

Maquette workshop

This workshop will take place outside using a life model for reference. You will learn how to sculpt a maquette from grogged clay.

A maquette is a three dimensional scale model made in order to plan materials and test ideas for a larger sculpture or work. Grog is clay which has been fired then ground up. It can come in many particle sizes, from fine to coarse and is used to help reduce shrinkage or cracking in clay during firing.

These workshops are funded by the William Kendall grant scheme so there will be no cost. However a £5 deposit is required to secure your place. This will be returned when you have completed all three sessions. Priority places will be allocated to those who have not previously attended a William Kendall funded course. Places need to be booked in advance.
